Hello, Neighbors!

This April will mark the start of our 2nd year as a Board. There are lots of ways, big and small, that you can get involved to help build community in our Hawks Valley neighborhood including opportunities mentioned in this newsletter. Please reach out to me or one of our Board members to express your interest.

Included in this newsletter is the invoice for your 2023 Association dues. Your prompt attention is appreciated. A large portion of these dues goes toward maintaining the areas along Woods and Midtown. Dues also cover association Board insurance, property insurance to cover the entrance signage, web costs, newsletter printing, and other miscellaneous administrative expenses. While our goal is to keep social events low/no-cost, on occasion we may also use a small portion of the funds to help offset event costs. As a volunteer Board, we are always looking for ways to keep expenses low; one example of this is that the Board treasurer performs all of the HOA accounting/tax preparation at no cost to the association, saving us over \$1,000 (which is how much the developer was paying for these services.)

Lastly, as a reminder, please be considerate when walking your pets by making sure they are always on a leash (per Madison ordinance) and also cleaning up after them. Your attention to this matter will keep our neighborhood residents (both 2-legged and 4-legged) safe and allow for a clean environment to prevent the spread of disease.



This meeting is an opportunity for members of the surrounding neighborhood (i.e., Hawks Valley) to ask questions and provide suggestions regarding the specific amenities to be located at the park.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

Annually, the Hawks Valley Architectural Control Committee (ACC) holds elections to fill seats on the committee. The ACC is established in the Hawks Valley covenants and restrictions to review specifications, site plans, and other documents for buildings and improvements in the neighborhood, subject to the approval authority of the Developer until the Developer ceases to have title to all Lots in Hawks Valley. In 2022, the committee proposed technical amendments to the covenants and is handling improvements to existing lots where those improvements are subject to the review of the committee.

If you wish to run for a seat on the committee, please indicate so to hawksvalleypresident@gmail.com by Feb 5. Include a personal statement not to exceed 250 words about why you are interested in serving on the ACC. Elections will be held for the committee among Lot Owners shortly thereafter.

SIDEWALK SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL

- Clear all snow and ice that accumulates on the sidewalk immediately adjacent to your property. Renters, refer to your lease agreement to determine how to handle snow removal.
- The entire width of the sidewalk must be cleared to ensure enough space to maneuver for everyone, including the elderly, disabled, and parents with strollers.
- Snow should be cleared by noon on the day after the snow stops; though the sooner and more completely the snow is removed, the less likely that the snow will become ice.
- If you cannot remove ice, use sand to provide traction (see page 3 for sand locations).
- Register to get notified of when sidewalks need to be cleared by visiting my.cityofmadison.com

THINGS TO DO TO HELP CITY CREWS

- Observe Alternate Side Parking Rules and Snow Emergency Regulations.
- Keep fire hydrants and storm sewer catch basins adjacent to your property free from ice and snow.
- Don't place refuse and recycling containers where they can be buried, damaged, or interfere with snow removal.
- Make sure mailboxes are installed according to United States Postal Service regulations.

STREET PARKING

Avoid a ticket or tow! Alternate Side Parking is in effect from November 15 - March 15, seven days a week, regardless of weather conditions.

- Park on the EVEN house numbered side of the street on even-numbered days from 1:00 am 7:00 am.
- Park on the ODD house numbered side of the street on odd-numbered days from 1:00 am 7:00 am.



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


